Marlies Rohmer Architects & Urbanists

Rohmer (b. 1957) is a Dutch architect who founded her practice, Marlies Rohmer Architects & Urbanists, in Amsterdam in 1986. Her impressively diverse portfolio ranges from large-scale inner-city developments to schools, houses, a mosque, utility buildings (such as a police station and a swimming pool), residential care complexes and interior projects, as well as one of the firm's most distinctive projects, a sports hall (below) with an undulating facade. In 2008, Rohmer was awarded the Amsterdam Prize for the Arts for her contribution to art in the city.
